Meet my dad: Gail Edward Didway. He used to have hair, but went for the clean look instead of comb-over in 1995.

At work, Dad was a tool and die maker, creating parts for Lockheed Martin, Boeing, and NASA. He made little tiny screws and other parts that could not have the slightest flaw for space shuttles and jet planes. He always came home glistening with metals shards.

At home, you are likely to find him reading a book in his recliner, and probably watching TV at the same time. The book is usually sci-fi, westerns, or period fiction. The TV is usually sports or Fox News. If he looks asleep, he's just "resting his eyes."

In past years, you might also find him outside fixing, building, trimming, planting, etc. I think he could build or fix just about anything.

He loves to laugh, to watch his children and grandchildren grow up, and to talk with just about anyone.

He has bowled multiple 300 games and used to play baseball and football. A favorite family story is how a bunch of guys from my sisters' college-age church group would come over to see if my dad could go play softball with them on Sunday afternoons. (My sisters and I got to tag along too).

I've learned a lot about life from Dad's choices. He never lost his temper. He was always there for family, no matter what. He often worked multiple jobs so my sisters and I could go to good schools. He never drank, smoked, or swore—teaching us girls that we could do those things when he did. He was always willing to take care of his grandchildren, even the ones in trouble. He grew up in poor circumstances, worked hard, and rolled with the financial punches whatever they may bring.

Dad is now 86 years old and lives in Winslow, Arizona, with one of my sisters. These days he spends more time in his recliner "resting his eyes." He also talks less but smiles more. This past month, though, his health has been touch and go. It's a reality that's hard for me to grasp. I know my dad as this capable, outgoing guy. My sister says it's heartbreaking to see him decline.

Praise the Lord, Dad's health has rebounded, and he is building up strength in the rehab. We hope to have him back home in the next week or so. Mom and I are going out for a visit in October.

This month, we honor our fathers on the third Sunday in June, so I just wanted to share a little bit about my dad.

EMAIL/TEXT SCAM ALERT

Please be aware that scammers are targeting pastor email or text accounts.

Here is how it works:

- 1. Scammer gets pastor's name and church from the web.
- 2. Scammer sends pastor an email or a text that looks like normal request.
- 3. Scammer steals pastor's contact list.
- 4. Scammer sends a request to everyone on the contact list for a favor, or help, in the pastor's name but from a bogus email address or phone number.
- 5. If a person responds to this request, there is usually a distressful story about sick or hungry or oppressed people who need money that has to be directly sent online.
- 6. DO NOT SEND THEM ANY MONEY. IT IS BEST TO NOT RESPOND TO THEM AT ALL.

PRECAUTIONS:

Pastor Nancy will NEVER ask for money that is not payable to the church through our normal banking procedures.

Pastor Nancy will NEVER ask for money via text or email.

Any time you receive an email or text asking for help or a favor from Pastor Nancy—check where it came from first. If it is NOT from pastor.nancy@drydenpres.com or 607-351-6966, then it is a scam. Pastor Nancy's official email always has the

Susquehanna vanc, Presbyterians Help Counter S Plastic Pollution

Our Presbytery overwhelmingly approved an overture "On Becoming Free from Plastic **Pollution**" for consideration at our General Assembly, June 28—July 5. You can read the full text on the OGA website: https://www.pc-biz.org/search/3001145. Please note there are now several concurring presbyteries supporting our overture.

Our Presbytery's overture concludes "Currently, 430 million tons of plastic is produced yearly resulting in a production of 11 billion metric tons of plastic in the last century, surpassing the biomass of all animals on earth. Despite efforts to convince people recycling is effective, only 9% of the plastic ever produced has been recycled, and 19% has been incinerated. Plastics are now one of the largest environmental disasters on our planet, polluting the Earth we are passing on to our children and subsequent generations. God placed Adam in the garden to serve it and to preserve it. It is time for the Presbyterian Church (USA) to preserve creation by becoming free from plastic pollution."

Al's Fudge Sauce

1/4 cup plus 2 tablespoons Cocoa powder

1 cup granulated sugar

3/4 cup evaporated milk

1/4 cup butter

1/8 teaspoon salt

1/2 teaspoon vanilla

Combine cocoa and sugar in a saucepan. Blend in evaporated milk. Add butter and salt. Cook, stirring constantly, until mixture begins to boil. Remove from heat. Stir in vanilla. Serve warm over ice cream and enjoy!

Missions:

Thanks to all who were able to respond to the Special Donation for One Great Hour of Sharing as we are able to send \$1234 to the Presbyterian Church USA. By pooling this with other OGHS donations, our denomination will be able to respond to needs of the Presbyterian Hunger Program, Disaster Assistance, and Self-Development of People, roughly about a third to each program.

Mission Committee in conjunction with the rest of the Church Ministry Committee is preparing for our continued outreach program to help Heifer International in their efforts to overcome poverty and hunger. This year we will be combining efforts from our congregation with the Dryden Dairy Day support as we reach out to the community at large to gain additional resources for Heifer aid. For our congregation, we plan for May 26, June 2, and June 9 to announce Heifer's work in different areas. Offering envelopes will be in the pews for donations. If using a check, make it out to Dryden Presbyterian Church and note it is for Heifer. Our Dairy Day presence will be different this year. We are planning a more visible presence from our church with Heifer display and game and kid give-a-ways and/or prizes of Heifer themed little items. In addition, as in the past, the church will be selling cookies and brownies, so expect more information coming on solicitation for assistance.

Nic Brenner from the Second Wind project addressed the congregation at morning worship on May 5 to update progress and plans for the future. In addition to continued prayers for success of this community outreach, all other means of support are welcome, including workers as the building heads toward completion. Additional means of contribution from us are being developed.

Operating Results

Contributions through April are 5% higher than last year. Pledge receipts are up by 14%. Plate and non-pledge receipts are down by 50% / 69%, respectively. **Expenses** through April are basically the same as last year except for small pay increases & associated taxes this year and three one-time costs incurred last year: (a) purchase of two stoves, (b) purchase of cellular fire alarm system and (c) preliminary repairs of the flooding of the nursery.

Nursery Repairs

Repairs of the water damage to the Nursery are finished. Al Avery made the initial repairs to the broken pipe and removed the damaged ceiling, wall section & floor in March of 2023 and replaced the ceiling & wall this spring at a total cost of \$ 3,852.33 (\$34 under the amount of the insurance check). Chris Baurle & Matt Seyfried generously replaced the floor with vinyl planking at no cost to the church which saved the church up to \$1,000 based on an estimate from a flooring company. *Thanks Chris & Matt.*
